

with the ultimate goal of encouraging its members in these fields but also strengthening the extroversion and promotion of the work of our Union.



The seminar was held in Romania with the participation of 7 national sections.

This year the seminar will be held in North Macedonia between May 24-28.

At the international level, it is very important to study and get to know each other between sections across the world. At the local level, there is a need for seminar days, local training courses and the establishment of an annual work plan for professional training for officials in the IPA.

The first plan of action for the new national board, was to hold a professional seminar day for the members of the presidency and the representatives of the branches. The goal was strategic planning to determine priorities and agree work plans of the officials in the presidency and the branches. At the same time, a seminar will be held for all the new officials elected to the position of branch chairman.



Additional professional seminars will be held during the year according to district division.

At the end of March there will be a national conference of activists where the work plans, budgets and activities will be presented and approved.

In Israel we hold national conferences several times a year. This is the advantage of a small country where travel distances are relatively short. Additional meetings and conferences will be held in the districts and sometimes also on Zoom. This enables us to update all the officials, keep in touch, work in partnership and coordination.

The new president of IPA Israel, Adv. Gal Sharon, is leading a broad course of organizational changes, amending the statue, professional training, expanding the circle of benefits for members, transferring information to all members through a new website, a new application and other means of communication. It should be remembered that the organization is operated by volunteers, at the national and local level, it is not a commercial company, or a government organization. The professional requirements and investment in training should be compatible with the level of investment of volunteers.


On March 15, 2023, within the Hînceşti Police Inspectorate, an event was organized to commemorate the ex-commissioner of the Hînceşti Police Station, Mihai Moraru, who died a hero's death for the sovereignty, independence, and territorial integrity of the Republic of Moldova, at 15.03.1992.

During the commemoration event, flowers were placed on the bust of the martyr and the memorial stone of the heroes fallen in the war.

Also, a march was organized in memory of the ex-commissioner of the Hînceşti Police Station, Mihai Moraru, traveling along the route Hînceşti city - Pogrebea village, Dubăsari district (the place of the martyr's death) - Brăneşti village, Orhei district (the place of origin and funeral) and the Vocational School from the city of Orhei (M. Moraru's place of study).

The event was organized with the support of the local public administration of the Hîncești district, the leadership of the Hîncești Police Inspectorate, the Association of Veterans of the Dniester War of the Hîncești Internal Affairs Organs "MIHAI MORARU", the Public Association of War Veterans from the Orhei District "Decebal" and of the Territorial Office of the A.O. "International Police Association" - Republic of Moldova Section".
