IPA AUSTRIA - XXI NATIONAL CONGRESS

After the difficulties caused by the coronavirus at the last congress, this year's event could be held in the usual manner from May 9 to May 12, 2024, at the Wyndham Grand Hotel in Salzburg. The former ski racer and police athlete. Alexandra MEISSNITZER. moderated the opening ceremony welcomed numerous and distinguished guests, such as the Provincial Police Director HR Mag. Dr. Bernhard RAUSCH, MBA, the Director General for Penal Institutions Mag. Friedrich KÖNIG, as well as the International IPA President Martin HOFFMANN, the International Vice President and Treasurer of Finance Michael WALSH, and an ensemble from the Salzburg Police Music.

In addition to the Federal Executive Board and the 80 delegates from all nine federal states, representatives from a total of 25 sections from several continents were present, including 15 IPA presidents. The officers of the Federal Executive Board reported on their activities over the past four years, and the auditors presented the financial situation of the association. Consequently, the managing board was relieved of its duties by the delegates.

Several amendments and adjustments to the statutes and three honorary memberships were decided upon. Numerous officials from all federal states were honored for their services to the IPA.

A special tribute was paid to the outgoing President of IPA Austria, Martin HOFFMANN, who was elected International IPA President in October 2023, during the gala evening. He was awarded the honorary presidency and honorary membership. The laudation was given by the new President, Robert Neumann.

POPE FRANCIS: "GREETINGS TO IPA, ENCOURAGING A GENEROUS COMMITMENT TO FRATERNAL SOLIDARITY."



ROME - They came from all over the world to St. Peter's Square on Wednesday 15th May and a generously sunny Rome welcomed them. We are talking about the 2000 policemen and their relatives who are members of the International Police Association, the association which, with its 400,000 members spread across the five continents, brings together members of the police forces from 68 nations, who have come to the capital of Italy to meet Pope Francis. There had to be a meeting and there was a meeting. The faces of the participants, starting with the international president Martin Hoffmann and his wife, international vice president Michael Walsh, together with the national president Nicolangelo Pezone, the deputy president Alfredo Iasuozzi and the vice president Antonio Molinaro, remained visibly sculpted by emotion at the moment in which the Pope announced the name of the IPA describes the Mission and conveying to all members what it is not belittling to say was a special Urbi et Orbi blessing limited to the world of the armed forces. IPA BRAZIL - GREEN IPA

This April 2024, the Brazilian Section of the IPA celebrated its 62 years as a member of the largest police association in the world, the IPA. The Christmas celebration chose to promote events topped by the Project: "IPA Green", declining the traditional Celebratory Dinner.

Cocktail commemorating the 62nd anniversary of IPA in Brazil, Planting of the book tree within the "Book Case" Project, in celebration of National Children's Book Day (18/04) and World Book Day (23/04) IPA Green at IPA Brazil – Taguapark, and launch of the project : Recovery

On April 20, 2024, the Brazilian Section of IPA participated in the IEB/ IPA deliberation, celebrated its anniversary and also the project: "IPA Green", in the area of its historic headquarters, with a beautiful and special ceremony that took place during the planting of three trees



that are part of our environmental environment, which are: The "Tree of Happiness", which is associated with abundance and growth and known in regional culture as being the amulet of good fortune; "Ipê Rosa", considered the symbol of strength and beauty, associated with the connection between human beings and nature, spiritual renewal and emotional healing; "Yellow Ipê", related to strength and vitality, representing perseverance and resilience. Finally, emerald grass seeds were distributed to everyone present to throw into the ground, as it is a perennial plant that forms a dense and soft lawn, symbolizing the union of everyone with the Earth, accompanied by a gift, the little plant: "succulent", considering them as guardian plants.

The event was attended by authorities at national and international level, such as the presence of the ambassador of peace in Brazil, Dr. Carlos Cruz, at which time a partnership was created between both institutions, and also with the presence of diplomatic and government, IPA members in Brazil and family members.

However, the Christmas festivities were not restricted only to the official Earth Day event, the theme of the celebrations related to the anniversary of IPA Brazil, as they also extended to other commemorative fields, for example: of the Riparian Forest, and culminating with the graduation of the IPA Brazil Academic Center class in 2023.

In the official Christmas word, the president of IPA in Brazil, Dr. Joel Zarpellon Mazo, concluded: "... we hope that as we continue in the year

2024, we will continue to follow together this path that we can assure as being the right course and plumb for the our national and international association. Long live IPA Brazil. Happy birthday. Servo Per Amikeco.

GREEN IPA - PLANT A TREE EVENT

THE SUCCESS STORY OF SCC GREEN IPA PROJECT

Earlier this year, during the strategic planning meeting held in Nottingham, UK, the IEB identified several key strategic pillars that represent the priorities for the IPA over the next four years.

A total of 12 projects were identified, and the Green IPA Project was one of them.

The Green IPA Project aims to: contribute to combat climate change, work towards creating a safer, more sustainable world for everyone, engage with external stakeholders to collaborate on mutual goals, and educate our members on the importance of environmental sustainability.

Under the Chairmanship of the SCC Chairperson Mr. Christos Parginos, the IPA Green Project Committee members comprising Biljana Dulovic (Project Lead), Jared Ojuok, Deirdre Mahony, and Asim Ali immediately embarked on the process of planning for the project implementation. After the deliberations, the committee settled on the modalities of implementation and dates and effectively communicated the same to all Sections.

The global event "PLANT a TREE-GREEN

IPA" to actualise the GREEN IPA Project globally was conducted from April 14th, culminating on April,22, Earth Day.

Organised by the individual Sections/Regions, the Green IPA Project brought together local communities, schools/colleges, government and non-governmental organisations, police officers and their families, and friends together to participate in tree planting.

Under the motto, "PLANT a TREE- GREEN IPA" the idea was for all the 372,000 IPA members around the world to plant at least one tree in their regions, in partnership with the local communities.

Several Sections printed merchandise to support the event, including T-shirts, banners, badges, and other promotional items, using the new IPA emblem and the project Motto, 'PLANT a TREE-GREEN IPA'.

After the event, they shared photos and videos of the event with the Socio-Cultural Commission Office.

The S.C.C will be creating a beautiful video, which we hope to present during the World Congress in Ohrid, North Macedonia.

Similarly, special recognition will be awarded to Sections with the greatest number of participants.

So far, our records indicate that a total of 23 countries participated in the exercise which has so far seen the planting of well over 1,000,000 seedlings.

The countries that have reported activities include: Albania, Austria, Brazil, Bulgaria, Colombia, Croatia, Germany, Gibraltar, Greece, Italy, Kenya, Lithuania, Moldova, Montenegro, New Zealand, North Macedonia, Pakistan, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, United Kingdom and members in Thailand.

Additionally the event was registered and joined the Generation Restoration Movement for Reviving Lands for a better future and IPA will be certified as a participant.

More, the Commission followed all procedures to UN Environment Programme and IPA will be a nominee for the Champion of Earth Award.

We look forward to more reports as the activity is continuing in other parts of the globe, with the promise of a greener, better earth for all of us.

We would like to thank all of you for supporting the event.

FORUM IPA ON PUBLIC OFFICIALS IN ITALY. FOR THE ITALIAN PRESIDENT PEZONE AND LA SCALA IS AN EXCELLENT FORMAT

BARI – The first national edition of the National Forum of Public Officials promoted by the president of the

arbitrators Avv. Antonio Maria La Scala was held in the crowded Nicolaus Congress Center in Bari. A full immersion training aimed at all managers, officials, public officials and those in charge of public service and through which it was possible, thanks to the presence of illustrious speakers, to take stock of

important issues such as those of crimes by public officials against the Public Administration, public procurement and the responsibilities of public employees in the exercise of their duties. There were several speakers including illustrious magistrates, experts in crimes against the Public Administration,

officials of the Anti-Mafia Investigation Directorate of Bari and public officials who discussed topics of interest to all public employees.



The institutional greetings of the president of the International Police Association Nicolangelo Pezone whose association sponsored the event together with Anci Puglia, Anfi, Anvu, Gens Nova and numerous

private partners, were followed by speeches by Adele Dr. Ciro Agelillis, Deputy Prosecutor at the Public Prosecutor's Office at the Court of Bari who indoctrinated those present by talking about the trafficking of illicit



influence in light of recent legislation and jurisprudence. It was then the lawyer's turn. Antonio Maria La Scala, President of the college of magistrates of the IPA as well

> as being a Criminal Lawyer of the Bari Court expert in Crimes of Public Officials against the Public Administration who with the report on the new criminal cases typical of Public Officials wanted to make an excursus on the disturbed freedom of auctions and illegal access to databases. Lieutenant Colonel Aldo Cavallo of the Anti-Mafia Investigation Directorate of

Bari spoke instead of the economic dimension of the mafia phenomenon and risks connected to money laundering. Finally, Celestina Barile, Lawyer of the Bari Chamber of Commerce, offered a very valid speech on transparency and corruption prevention measures as well as on the risks and opportunities in the fight against corruption in the time of big data and artificial intelligence. Dr. moderated everything. Nicola Leone Local Police Officer/Commander. The organizers and the president of the IPA were very satisfied and he, together with the lawyer Antonio La Scala, said he was ready to support, always with the patronage of the IPA, any re-proposals of what has all the useful elements to be defined as a 'excellent opportunity for training and therefore crime prevention.

IPA AUSTRIA - HELP UKRAINE CHILDREN



The fact that a small idea can become a great thing has already been proven by the "Help Ukraine Children" initiative in December 2023. The sections of IPA Romania and IPA Austria have made it their mission to support families of police officers whose fathers and/or sons have died in the fighting during the ongoing war between Ukraine and Russia.

Since the beginning of 2024, the two initiators and those responsible, the Vice President of the IPA Section Romania Marius Muresan and the President of the IPA Styria Elke Strohmeyer, have been planning a new aid campaign. This second phase of "Help Ukraine Children" took place in Vicovu des Sus from 08-10 April 2024.

In the presence of the IPA President of the Romanian Section, Mihai Tartareanu, and the Vice-President of the IPA Section Austria, Kurt Walker, seven families of deceased or missing police officers were helped. Once again, a considerable sum of money was raised from the Austria, Romania, and several Styrian local groups to buy notebooks, food, and clothing for the bereaved. At the same time, the IPA Moldova section, led by President Mihai Cebotari, also joined the relief effort. On the part of IPA Suceava, under the responsibility of Vice-President Petru Patrauceam, a ceremonial handover was held in the Ukrainian city of Crasna in the historical region of Bukovina. In the presence of the Secretary General of the IPA Section Ukraine Viktor Osiannykov, the Mayor of Crasna and Vicovu de Sus, the delegation from Romania, Austria and Moldova was warmly welcomed in the auditorium of the local high school.

A 4th grade class of an Austrian middle school from Burgenland also took the "Help Ukraine Children" campaign as an opportunity to send 14 nicely decorated and bulging shoe boxes to Ukraine to bring joy to local children.

"Help Ukraine Children" not only shows what IPA sections of different countries can do together, it also reflects the spirit of the International Police Association, true to the motto "Servo per Amikeco".

Finally, the initiators would like to express their gratitude for the renewed support and promotion of this unique aid project and hope for a continuation and, of course, an early end to these terrible hostilities.

INTO THE EUROPEAN UNION -

CHALLENGES OF ILLEGAL MIGRATION

Content

This seminar will look at the causes of flight and refugee movements into the EU over the last 10 years. Border security strategies will be presented and discussed. The introduction of stationary border controls within Europe and their impact on irregular migration movements will be illustrated using the example of Germany.

The situation of the countries on the external borders of the EU will be illustrated with the example of Greece. The situation in the camps on the Greek islands of Lesbos, Samos, Kos, Chios and Leros will be discussed.

IPA SPAIN - TACTICAL POLICE INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS

SERVO PER AMIKECO



IPA Spain, through its IPA Avila group, organises the second edition of this Police Congress, which is getting bigger every year.

- Registrations had to be closed in less than 4 minutes from the opening due to more than 400 registrations, having only 250 places available.

- This year, 24 instructors from the IPA Tactical Police group attended the congress and it was finally possible to increase the number of participants to 300.

The second edition of the International Congress of the IPA Tactical Police Group of Spain took place on the 6th of April in the National Police School of the city of Avila. Two consecutive years organising an event where seminars and lectures on police intervention are held. Always looking for the best training for our police officers, tools are used to carry out their work professionally, safely and efficiently, and in accordance with the laws in force.



Autonomous Communities belonging to IPA Spain. And following the motto that gives meaning to IPA "Servo per Amikeco", this event was totally free for all the attendees.

The morning started with the presentation of the Congress, taking the floor first of all Mr. José R. Madera, Secretary of IPA Ávila and in representation of the National Police School, inaugurated the Congress, thanking the School and its Management for opening its doors to this second edition. He also thanked the sponsors who made it possible for the event to go ahead with their contributions, and all those present for their confidence in the IPA. Finally, he reminded everyone of the internal rules of the School so that the event could run as smoothly as possible. The President of IPA Avila, Mr. David Lopez, then continued by briefly informing what the International Police Association is all about, thanking the other speakers at the opening table for their hard work in coordinating and organising the Congress, and finally he gave a brief presentation of the seminars and talks and how they would be developed.

He ended by giving the floor to the IPA Avila Training

member Mr. Santiago Jimenez informed about the IPA who Tactical Police group, encouraging those present to have a good time and to make an effort to take advantage of the great training experience of the Instructors who would be giving the seminars. Finally, Mr. Ángel Cantalapiedra, president of IPA Castile and León, spoke on behalf of the entire Delegation to which he belongs, and presented the Secretary of the IPA Ávila with a medal of thanks

to the Management of the National Police School for their involvement in the Congress.

The event was organised in training blocks where all attendees attended a 3-hour seminar in the morning and a different one in the afternoon. police batons and shackles, Transition of weapons, Non-lethal means of arrest and Entry and search.

It was coordinated in blocks so that the training received in the morning could be continued in the afternoon. In this way, 6 simultaneous training blocks were organised with a minimum of 2 instructors per seminar, as follows: In the morning, the following seminars are held: Health Tactics, Handling of short weapons, Handling of extendable police batons and shackles, Transition of weapons, Non-lethal means of arrest and Entry and search.

In the afternoon, the following seminars were held: Progression in CQB buildings, Intervention in vehicles, Self-protection, Arrest techniques, Reduction of violent persons, Intervention with a knife, Blackman and Tactical pen.

The morning and the afternoon were headed by two lectures, "Detention practice" in the morning and "Stress in armed interventions" in the afternoon, where thanks to the capacity of the colossal Auditorium of the National Police School all attendees were able to attend at the same time. The afternoon presentation brought one of the emotional moments of the day, with the intervention of Carlos, Mosso D'Escuadra, who was shot in the line of duty in his forearm during an armed intervention. The attendees asked numerous questions from which it was possible to draw the conclusion that a good job is being done with the organisation of this Congress and the training provided. In addition, Carlos, as a final conclusion, claimed that it was precisely more training for our police officers that should be demanded, for more and more frequent cases where the integrity of those who act or that of the citizens to be protected is at stake.

As an anecdote, it should be noted that the expectation in this Congress was such that, in less than 4 minutes from the opening of registration, the 300 places of the maximum capacity available were filled. This year there were more IPA members from all over Spain who travelled to Avila to attend the event, exactly 48 IPA members, some of whom travelled more than 1000 kilometres to attend the Congress. The rest were students from the School who are training to join the National Police. In addition, this Congress has tripled the number of students who become members and want to belong to this great IPA family, benefiting from the advantages of belonging to the largest Police Association in the world.

The closing ceremony took place at 9 p.m. in the Auditorium where different raffles were held by our sponsors who gave away products and products of the brands they represented. We started with the delivery of 25 pairs of anti-cut gloves by the company Ansell, 4 shooting glasses by Bollé Safety, 30 patches and 2 commemorative coins of the Bicentenary of the National Police by Mr. Policía, 1 tactical belt and 3 caps by Iberican Armor and a double lock Ultimate shackle by TCH Spain.

In addition, there was one more surprise, as the author of the book "Sobre la violencia policial" Lucas Canteras, an IPA member, attended the Congress as a student and wanted to contribute 3 copies of his book to be raffled among all the attendees.

And of course, at the end of the event, the popular exchange of patches between the Portuguese police officers and the organisation of the Congress took place.

One of the goals of the IPA Tactical Police group would be to have the presence of more IPA countries in future editions in order to have round tables where to exchange experiences and ways of proceeding of the different Police from all over the world in front of police interventions.

BUT... WHAT IS IPA TACTICAL POLICE?

It is a project of 2 members of IPA Spain, Instructors of Tactical Health and Police Operations who got down to work to ask all the IPA Spain Groups and Delegations for those members interested in forming part of this group called IPA Tactical Police. Therefore, a multitude of CVs were received from police officers from all over Spain, selecting the best who had training and experience in operational positions, and creating a team of 30 instructors from IPA Spain.

It took much more than 2 years to organise the Group, but in the end it has borne fruit with two successful Congresses already held.

We are already working and coordinating the III IPA Tactical Police Congress, which will be full of excellent specialised training and good times in a unique police environment. In addition, we will try to get more countries interested in this project so that it can grow and become bigger and bigger every year.
