## INTRODUCTION FROM LEGAL ADVISOR MICHAEL BOOLSEN



### Legal Advisor. Why, What and Who?

Following the World Congress in Barcelona in 2023 and the IEC's recognition of the IEB's wish to take a legal advisor on board, I was chosen for this position. However, at least some of you may wonder why there is a need for a legal advisor, and what does such a person do.

#### Why?

It is a common notion that society is becoming more and more complicated and that handling this complexity requires the aid of persons with a broad variety of education, inter alia lawyers. I think that many of you will recognise this picture from your daily work. As IPA is an integral part of society, this development naturally and inevitably also influences the work of IPA.

Recognising this is not something new; past IEB's have also considered the possibility of making use of the services of a legal advisor.

But why exactly a legal advisor? Well, admitted, persons with a different education might also be in scope for this advisory role. However, many of the questions that arise are of a legal nature or have a clearly legal bearing. Politics is of course the prerogative of the IEB (and naturally the IEC). Yet, at the same time politics is inevitably intertwined with law, thus requiring legal advice.

In my capacity of legal advisor, you would probably consider me biased when judging whether the role of the legal advisor makes sense or not. Yet, in my capacity of president of Section Denmark I allow myself to consider it very wise to have asked the services of a legal advisor.

#### What?

There are of course the obvious questions regarding interpretation of legal framework of the IPA. This is at the core of the business of the legal advisor.

The package, though, is larger than that. As an example, I could refer to the question of the IPO and how we handle this organisation. Questions considered have been many. Should we take legal action against the IPO for infringement of our intellectual property rights? Should we oblige our members to distance themselves from IPO, as we consider this organisation to – at least in some respects – acting entirely contrary to the objectives of the IPA? Should we clearly distance the IPA from the IPO?

IPO is of course not the only question arising. Sadly, some sections have ended up in serious quarrels, which have been based on different interpretations of IPA rules.

### INTRODUCTION FROM LEGAL ADVISOR MICHAEL BOOLSEN

In such matters the IEB have been advising the parties, and my task has been to advise the IEB.

As you can see from the above, law and politics are intertwined, and reaching the politically right decision often is combined with legal advice. We all want an IPA, which stands on a safe and strong basis when making decisions, be it the IEB or the IEC. In my opinion, the legal advisor can assist the decision process by giving advice on what is legally feasible and coherent with especially international regulations.

Who

I have been the president of Section Denmark since 2007 and have participated in all world congresses since 2007. As a matter of fact, I still remember how proud my son, who today is 30 years old, was at the age of 12 when his father was elected president.

I am a lawyer, and I have been serving with Danish Police for 37 years as a prosecutor, police counsel and many other interesting functions. Today I am the commissioner of police of the Faroe Islands, those tiny 18 islands in the North Atlantic, which form a part of the Kingdom of Denmark. Police in the Faroes form a part of Danish Police, and the Faroe Islands Police are thus a region within IPA Section Denmark.

My aim as president of Section Denmark has always been to secure that the organisation is attractive to all serving or having served within Danish Police inter alia by upholding Arthur Troop's basic vision of friendship among employees of the police across borders and political differences.

I hope I have lifted at least part of the veil that you may have found covering the role of the legal advisor. Let me end by saying that I believe in a bright future of the IPA based on friendship and mutual understanding and this is the basis for my work as a legal advisor.


Together, we've taken a significant step toward a greener future—while proudly upholding the ideals and values of the International Police Association.

My journey with the International Police Association began in 1992 during a training visit to Denmark. There, I encountered the idea of IPA for the first time—a global police association based on the motto Servo per Amikeco – "To Serve Through Friendship." Shortly afterward, I became a member, receiving membership card no. PL 028.

From the very beginning, I actively engaged in building bridges between officers from different countries. I coorganised numerous exchanges, study visits, and conferences. Thanks to the contacts established through IPA, young people could participate in international projects, and police officers had opportunities to explore practices of other law enforcement services. Over the years, I hosted officers from countries such as Israel, Germany, Denmark, Hungary, and France, and I also participated in many international initiatives myself.

Within the structures of the IPA Polish Section, I proudly held positions as General Secretary, Deputy Secretary, and Vice President. I was also responsible for coordinating with the International Training Centre in IBZ Gimborn, where I helped define seminar topics and organized Polish delegations.

It was a privilege to see IPA become a platform for exchanging knowledge between police, prosecutors, and border quards.

IPA, however, is more than professional development. It's a space for genuine friendship and social engagement. Throughout my years of service, I witnessed how the association supports education, culture, youth integration, and the promotion of a positive image of the police. As part of the "Placement Programme," I hosted international participants and also visited other countries as an IPA representative.



Today, more than three decades later, I still proudly wear the IPA badge. I continue to promote the idea of the association in high schools, among police personnel, and within senior citizen communities. I firmly believe that the values IPA stands for—friendship, solidarity, cooperation—remain as relevant as ever in our changing world.

On the occasion of IPA's 75th anniversary, I wish all members continued success, inspiring connections, and the conviction that being part of this unique community is truly worthwhile.

# IPA NORWAY 70<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY AND NATIONAL CONGRESS



During the last weekend of April, IPA section Norway carried out its 28<sup>th</sup> national congress.

The congress was held in the old fortified town of Fredrikstad. Now, the whole town isn't fortified anymore, but the old parts of the town are. We had a tour in the old town as the social and cultural part of the gathering.

Region East (11) was technical organiser for the congress and provided a very nice and successful national congress. Some also brought their spouses, making the spare time of the congress also a social arena.

The congress opened on Friday 25<sup>th</sup>. Two of the speakers were Inger Grete Lia and Therese Lutnæs who presented their experience after attending She is IPA in Gimborn. They spoke of a useful and inspiring gathering. They experienced that too many women lack the respect and possibilities one should expect.

One participant, a recent mother, brought with her some-month old baby-boy. As she stated, this was the only way she could attend, and she wanted to participate. The baby-boy also showed interest of IPA, crawling about in the congress-room.



The meeting was successful, and one former member was honoured for her service, Monica Lillevik, with a badge of honour. Lillevik sadly had to leave IPA, as she started a new career outside the police. She has been the Secretary General for several years, providing the section with stability and knowledge on the organisation. One former holder of a badge of honor was decorated as a honorary member, Geir Larsen. He has excelled himself by amongst other things, by working with and supporting IPA in the Balkans.

IPA section Norway was established in 1954, as the fifth section of IPA, thus making its 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2024. We found the National congress a suitable opportunity for a celebration. We marked the anniversary with speeches on the section history and the way forth towards 100 years. As IPA section Norway first was founded in Oslo, there were only members in the capital. This was to change in 1963 as Bergen stepped up and became our second region. Much was learned, as there were no directions on the use of powers of attorney then, thus some members represented more than 60 others. Later this clearly had to be regulated. We got a history lesson on how that formed IPA section Norway.

# IPA NORWAY 70<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY AND NATIONAL CONGRESS

In 1954 the annual fee was kr 10,-, equals Euro 1. Since then, we´ve had some 944% price increase, thus, the price was probably noticeable for the time. A senior member, Kjell Berg of the Oslo region (1), provided the celebration with the very first ledger, neatly written down, cent by cent.

The meetings final issue was electing a new national board. The congress entrusted Jan Tore Hagnes 3 more years as president. The board was changed in some posts, making Gunnar Baardsen officially the Secretary General. Three new members now fills the roles as treasurer, secretary for social medias and board member with responsibility as travel secretary and representative to the Gimborn talks. The board is now represented by more women.

As head of social committee is in service for the United Nation, Hans Sørheim will be acting head of social committee until Thorben Westgård returns.

On Saturday, after the official program, we got a guided tour through the fortified old town, established in the mid 1600's as a defence against Sweden. Then it was a purely military establishment, now only serving as a tourist attraction with no military presence. Instead of guns, there were bars, making this spring weekend even better.

## EASTER CAMPAIGN OF IPA AUSTRIA IN UKRAINE

As in 2023 and 2024, the head of the regional group of Styria and 3rd Vice President, Elke Strohmeyer, organised another support campaign together with IPA Romania. The goal was to help children of Ukrainian border police officers (Help Ukraine Children) who died in the war against Russia.

On April 6, 2025, Elke drove her car, which was fully loaded with gifts for 15 Ukrainian children and 60



shoeboxes filled with presents for the special education center in Mukachevo, Ukraine. These shoeboxes were lovingly packed by first-year students from the secondary school in Güssing. First, she drove to Cluj, where she picked me up at the airport. Then we continued more than 300 kilometres to Sighetu Marmaţiei, where the Secretary General of IPA Romania, Marius Mureşan, and the regional IPA President of Maramureş, Silviu Palagi, were already waiting for us.

On the morning of April 8, 2025, we visited the commander of the border police in Sighetu Marmaţiei, General Florin Coman. He informed us about the ongoing challenges in monitoring the more than 650-kilometre-long border with Ukraine. After giving him some small gifts, we crossed the narrow wooden bridge over the Tisza River to the Ukrainian border. Our gift-filled car was carefully checked there. After a short drive, we arrived at the Romanian consulate in Solotvyno, Ukraine. There, the consul Mr. Gratian Florin Parvu and the Ukrainian children were already waiting for us. The gifts from IPA Romania and IPA Austria were handed over there. All the children were overwhelmed by the many presents.



Since we did not have enough time to visit the children at the special education center in Mukachevo, the gifts were given to them later, on April 16, 2025, by Consul Gratian Florin Parvu and IPA President Silviu Palagi.

The Easter campaign of IPA Austria was once again a great success and shows the strength of the global, practical network of the IPA, true to the founder Arthur Troop's motto: servo per amikeco (service through friendship). IPA helps wherever help is needed.

### 15<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF IPA BOSNIA & HERZEGOVINA

From May 2-4.2025, at the Jelena Hotel in Brčko, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the 15th anniversary of the establishment of the Association of Police Officers in BiH (IPA BiH) was celebrated.

The ceremonial part of the assembly was held with welcoming speeches by the President of the IPA BiH Assembly Goran Žulj, the host Milan Nikolić and the President of the IPA BiH Šero Družić. The said assembly was attended by, among others, the President of the Brčko City Assembly, a representative of the Brčko District Government and the Assistant Chief of Police of the Brčko District. On this occasion, gifts were presented to officials and sections of Montenegro, Croatia, Macedonia, Slovenia and Serbia;



During the working part of the Assembly, reports on the work and finances of the section for 2024 and plans for 2025 were adopted, as well as other decisions important for the functioning of the section;

In the morning, the stands of the Sections of Macedonia, Serbia, Montenegro, Slovenia and local regional clubs (IPA USK, IPA HBŽ, IPA ŽZH, IPA Sarajevo and IPA Brčko) are on display. Autochthonous products from the mentioned countries and regions, as well as advertising material from sections and clubs, were placed on the stands;

The present members were greeted by the president of IPA BiH Šero Družić and the vice president of IPA BiH Milan Nikolić.

## MULTICULTURALISM IN IPA BRANCHES IN ISRAEL

The Israel Police Association has 120 branches, half of which are serving police officers and half are retired.

The Israel Police and the Prison Service include members of different religions, denominations, and beliefs. Even among members of the same religion, there are many differences.



Among the Christians there are Catholics, Orthodox, Protestants. For example, among the Orthodox there are Greeks, Russians, Romanians and more.

This has a meaning when celebrating holidays, send greetings, and conducting rituals.

Among the IPA branches in Israel, there is one prominent sector, mainly in the north of the country where most of the Druze and Circassian members are concentrated. There are communities where most of the residents are Druze and there are Circassian villages. What sets these communities apart is that most of them serve in the Israel Police, the Prison Service and the army. In these communities, there are large IPA branches of retirees. The police officers in service are members of branches in police units throughout the country.



The Israel Police includes all those who serve in it in a uniform and equal manner.

In the International Police Association, the situation is different, since the emphasis is placed on cultural and social activities in which holidays, customs, and rituals are celebrated.

In IPA Israel we have, Jews, Muslims, Druze, Circassians, Bedouins, Christians and others. To demonstrate the multicultural complexity, among the Jews there are people from Arab countries, Europe, Africa, Asia, Oceania, there are countless customs and traditions.



## MULTICULTURALISM IN IPA BRANCHES IN ISRAEL



The Druze celebrate holidays, some of which coincide with Muslim holidays, some of which are

unique.

The IPA Israel presidency has two serving members who are Druze and two who are retired. Last month we celebrated Druze Women's Day and towards the end of the month the Feast of Sacrifice.

Because of the uniqueness of the Druze members, there are activities dedicated to Druze saints, holidays and special events.



These branches are special and are defined by us as the rural sector. Among the members of these branches are retired senior officers and also many who have become religious.

The Druze religion is secret, so only those who have decided to be religious are exposed to it, and then they are required to wear a special mustache and head covering.



At IPA Israel we make sure to give respect to members of all religions, sects, and beliefs. I don't know of an IPA section in the world with such a unique complexity of multiculturalism as in Israel.

#### **63 YEARS OF IPA BRAZIL**



The Brazilian Section of the International Police Association – IPA Brazil celebrated this April 1, 2025 its 63 years as a member of the International Police Association – IPA, the largest police class association in the world. Janeiro, Dr. Helio Machado, and Dr. Giulieny Matos, member of the Ethics Council of IPA Brasil, in a beautiful event promoted on March 22, 2025, in conjunction with UNISCECAP University, at the Parlamundi Auditorium in Brasília-DF.

#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM IPA ICELAND

Its been an eventful first half of the year for Section Iceland. Two social events, IEB visit, national annual meeting and the biggest professional seminar in our history.

In the name of friendship Section Iceland decided that this event was relevant for all first responders from a training standpoint so the guestlist was long; Police, Fire, EMT, Hospital staff, Red Cross, civilian 112 dispatchers, volunteer SAR personnel, supervisors etc. attended the event. With most hotel venues being booked already I ended up booking the Reykjavik City Theatre for this event and sincere thanks go out to the Theatre staff for their professionalism and service.



For the rest of the year we will at least try and host a social gathering but for 2026 we have some ideas that we are putting together and see what the budget allows.

So far this year we have registered 14 new members and we just sent the most recent graduating classes a flyer with information about the IPA and its work domestically and abroad.

#### **IPA ITALY REMEMBER POPE FRANCIS**







ROME - They came from all over the world on May 15th a year ago, in St. Peter's Square and a





generously sunny Rome welcomed them. There were 2000 policemen belonging to the International Police Association, the association which, with its 400,000 members spread across five continents, brings together members of the police forces of 68 nations. They had come to the capital of Italy to meet Pope Francis.





The caps with the unmistakable logo had coloured the stalls of the square framed by Bernini's colonnade blue, almost as if to reflect the blue sky that had characterized that special Vatican morning.

The faces of the participants, starting from the international president Martin Hoffmann and his together Mick Walsh wife, with former international vice president and the national president Nicolangelo Pezone, the deputy president Alfredo Iasuozzi and the vice president Antonio Molinaro, were visibly sculpted by emotion at the moment in which Francesco had announced the name of the IPA, describing its Mission and sending to all the members what it is not belittling to say was a special Urbi et Orbi blessing limited to the world of forces armies.

"Greetings to the International Police Association, encouraging a generous commitment of fraternal solidarity", this was and will be, as if he had instilled in his soul the existential verb of an association such as the one founded by Arthur Troop who bases his creed on solidarity, the phrase of the good Pope, of the Right Pope, of the Pope of the last and weakest of us of the IPA, the phrase uttered by Francis and which we will carry tattooed on our hearts.



#### **IPA ITALY REMEMBER POPE FRANCIS**

A Pope who came almost from the end of the world and who overturned perspectives has passed away. Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the first Jesuit Pope in history, passes away; a simple Pope, one of those who, when he was a cardinal in Buenos Aires, took the bus to the suburbs of the villas miserias, shacks full of people who were starving and who couldn't distinguish whether he was a simple priest or the archbishop he was.

We were greeted by a Pope who, after one of the first nights, at dawn sees a young Swiss guard outside the door, "have you been up all night, son?", he makes him sit down and offers him breakfast; a Pope who goes to the shops in person to change glasses or shoes, brings his own hand luggage and is amazed at the amazement that this original way of doing things arouses in those who see it.





The Pope of the suburbs left us, who gave voice and visibility to the least of the Earth, to the discarded, involved in the affairs of peoples who are of no interest to anyone, kept out of bounds by global communication. Many things about him will remain in my memory, such as the first surprise trip he made among the migrants to Lampedusa, which has become the cemetery of the Mediterranean, or when he highlighted the fact that bridges are always solutions, never walls.

In short, a Great Man has passed away even before an incomparable Pope.

### **IPA GERMANY EXCHANGE VISIT**



Global Friendship in Action: IPA Exchange Visit from Baltimore County, USA

On May 1st, 2025, the Frankfurt Police Headquarters proudly welcomed a very special guest as part of our commitment to international exchange and friendship:

Andrew Dove, 28, Shift Supervisor from Baltimore County, Maryland, and a long-standing member of the International Police Association (IPA).

This visit was much more than just a professional tour—it was a vivid example of the power and value of our international IPA network, which continues to build bridges across borders, cultures, and police traditions.

Andrew's visit began at the Directorate of Traffic Safety, where Director Mr. Heberer and his dedicated team provided an in-depth presentation of their work.

The operational planning for major public events, such as Germany's largest cycling race held annually in Frankfurt, particularly captured Andrew's attention.

The next stop took Andrew into the heart of real-time policing: the Operations and Situation Center. Here, under the guidance of Police Operations Leader Mr. Schmidl, Andrew experienced the impressive coordination and technology that drive large-scale police responses. The seamless integration of communication, strategy, and field deployment was a powerful reflection of German policing in action.

In addition, the start of the authorisation process was coordinated, with a Directorial Resolution of the General Command of the Peruvian Police, for the use of the International Police Association headband on the PNP Uniform.

Another key insight came through the visit to the Criminal Duty Service, where Andrew explored the interface between emergency response and investigative work.



### **IPA GERMANY EXCHANGE VISIT**

The day offered not only professional exchange but also powerful symbolic moments: a high-ranking representative of the U.S. Consulate welcomed Andrew personally, acknowledging the value of cross-cultural police cooperation. A commemorative coin presented to Andrew marked the occasion, serving as a symbol of appreciation and the strong transatlantic friendship shared between our two countries—and between IPA members everywhere.

Later, at Police Station 1, a spontaneous conversation with a colleague of American heritage highlighted once again the personal connections that make IPA unique. That sense of camaraderie deepened when Andrew joined officers during an ongoing operation, witnessing and supporting real-time policing that led to several arrests related to drug trafficking. It was a moment of shared purpose that transcended national borders.





Andrew also shared his experiences during an interview with the Frankfurter Neue Presse, emphasizing the tremendous value of international cooperation, not only for expanding knowledge but for reinforcing the human side of policing.

During a deployment at a public demonstration, he witnessed firsthand the principles of de-escalation and community policing that characterize the work of German police forces.

On May 2nd, the exchange continued with a visit to the Federal Police at Frankfurt Airport, one of Europe's busiest international hubs. Thanks to IPA member Bernd Hellmann, Andrew was received warmly by Commander Johannes Ament and Public Relations Officer Carsten Ziebler of Inspection V. A behind-the-scenes airfield tour revealed fascinating insights into aviation security and operations.

### **IPA GERMANY EXCHANGE VISIT**

Deputy Commander Gregor Engbers of Inspection III, together with colleague Nikolas Reuter, led Andrew through the terminals and explained the day-to-day challenges of airport security. In a heartfelt gesture that captured the spirit of IPA friendship, Gregor—a proud IPA member for over 30 years—presented Christian Heckens with a rare FBI coin as a personal token of international solidarity and lifelong connection.

This visit was far more than a schedule of appointments. It was a living example of what the IPA stands for: "Servo per Amikeco"—Service through Friendship. The exchange of knowledge and experience is essential, but it is the genuine human connection, the shared understanding, and the mutual respect among police officers across borders that define the heart of our global IPA family.

# IPA NETHERLANDS LOWLANDS TRAINING EDITION 2025

IPA Limburg-Noord (Netherlands) and IPA Provincie Antwerpen (Belgium) have had a close cooperation for several years now.

On Friday 2 and Saturday 3 May 2025, the fourth edition of the Low Lands Training Edition event took place. After last year's third edition of this event took place in Sevenum, it was this time to go to Belgium. The event's primary target group are Dutch and Belgian IPA members. Through a two-day training course, the organisers want to give IPA members from both countries a behind-the-scenes look at each other's tactics. This first day ended with snacks and drinks. Indeed, the social aspect is at least as important at the IPA as the educational part. During this get-together, stories and experiences were exchanged and valuable contacts were made for the future. It is great to see how a group of people manage to become friends within just one day.

On Saturday, the programme included simulations. For instance, the participants had to perform a vehicle check in which a weapon was suddenly involved. Together with dog handler Sam and K9 Trix, the suspect was apprehended. After this, the participants had to search for concealed spaces. For this, the Belgian Federal Police, led by Andy, had brought some fully prepared luxury cars with hidden spaces. Despite the fact that a lot of (international) knowledge and experience was present, this turned out to be anything but an easy job. In fact, the spaces in these vehicles were very difficult to find.

In front of the Celje Police Directorate, they planted a "tree of friendship" together with colleagues from IPA Skopje, IPA Strumica, IPA Kumanovo, and IPA Region Shtip, in cooperation with the Municipality of Celje and the Celje Police Directorate.

# IPA POLAND TRAVELER PROJECT SECOND EDITION



The "Traveler" project was an experiment in 2023 – and some even claimed it was a joke that would fail. Initially, three suitcases with the IPA Silesia logo were individually ordered, with the intention of lending them out for IPA Silesia events. After showcasing the gadget, suggestions emerged to expand the "Traveler" bags with IPA flags to complement the project. As a result, 20 square flags matching the logo and idea were produced.

The first edition in 2023 turned out to be a surprising success for both organisers and originators.

The suitcases and flags travelled through countries such as the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Miskolc Thermal Baths (Hungary), Austria, Croatia, Bulgaria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ireland, Hungary (Lake Balaton), the Netherlands, Germany, France, Turkey, and Greece. Then they left the old continent and reached Jordan, Cyprus, Egypt, Thailand, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Australia, Bali, Madagascar, and Zanzibar. In total, in 2023 alone, they covered 105,825 kilometers – one way.

At that point, the world – and the project – paused to take a deep breath. As the Chinese proverb goes, "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." We waited for a response in 2024. The flags again spread out across nearly all Silesian IPA Regions and set off on new adventures with the suitcases.

At first, we aimed merely to match the success of the previous year. However, it turned out that our travel gadget climbed mountain peaks, dived into seas, crossed deserts, and plunged into the depths of caves. The adventure was simply meant to continue. And in the end, after summarising the 2024 season, the outcome exceeded all expectations.

In total, the three "Traveler" suitcases and flags visited four continents and dozens of countries – sometimes multiple times – including: France, Zanzibar, Austria, Czech Republic, Taiwan, Australia, Italy, Germany, USA, Slovakia, Portugal, Poland, England, the Netherlands, China, Italy, Spain, Turkey, Albania, Egypt, Serbia, Greece, Montenegro, Sweden, Denmark, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Thailand, Cyprus, South Korea, Malta, and Mexico. The most unbelievable place our flag waved? The demilitarized zone between South and North Korea – on the "right side," of course. In total, an estimated 200,022 kilometres were travelled (one-way), and since everything returned, the total distance is almost 10 times the circumference of the Earth!

We're still negotiating to send our flag on a mission to the International Space Station (ISS), which is only 408 km from Earth – but whether that will happen remains to be seen.

#### Editorial by Nic Bannan - IPA Australia

My scholarship journey started in early 2023 when I applied for the award. I have always had an interest in innovative technologies and how we can integrate them into policing. In December 2023 when I was casually reading the December issue of the IPA Police Down under magazine at Belconnen Police Station in the ACT, while heating up my dinner, with excitement I read on page 15 I was one of the two successful Australian applicants for the Arthur Troop Scholarship 2024. Within a week I had confirmed that I had been awarded and my next task was organising what would be one of the most memorable adventures of my life thus far. I was fortunate to have a study topic and course already decided. My scholarship application identified a clear topic of interest being the use of drones in policing, fortunately for me IBZ Gimborn holds a seminar on that very topic. My next task was fitting as many IPA opportunities as possible into a three-week trek through northern Germany. I eventually decided on an itinerary of Berlin, Hamburg, Dusseldorf, Gimborn (course), Koblenz and Frankfurt.

#### **BERLIN**

My time in Berlin started late in the evening of the 23<sup>rd,</sup> having travelled for the 30 hours previous I was ready for some deserved sleep (not in an airplane chair). The following day I literally 'hit the ground running.' I booked a walking tour of Berlin in an attempt to see as much as I could of the city in the short time I had. Breakfast that morning would ignite a love affair with the German Backerei, something my belt line would not be pleased with by the end of the trip. As a history buff the energy and constant state of change in Berlin always interest me, to see the city and be there was something I had wanted for a long time. I was fortunate to visit sites such as: Checkpoint Charlie, the remnants of the wall at the Topography of Terror, the holocaust memorial and the beautiful buildings that populate museum island. www.ipa-international.org



In the afternoon I booked a tour of the BMW Motorrad Factory, where all BMW motorbikes are born. Being an avid bike rider and a BMW rider, I felt this was a pilgrimage when visiting Berlin. The factory was excellent, an amazing experience seeing the finest in German engineering, no Police motorbikes but still a worthwhile experience. I spent the evening finding a traditional German restaurant to meet my craving for a pork knuckle and sauerkraut.

On 25 September I organised for the first of many connections with our German IPA friends. Manuel from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Technical Unit of the Berlin Police picked me up for a day with the Berlin Riot Squad, as a public order officer in Canberra I was keen to see how our German friends operated. On arrival at their Headquarters, which is in a 1930's Luftwaffe barracks, I was fortunate to meet with the battalion's leadership and see their beautiful historic headquarters. The battalions' offices were like something out of a movie, intentionally hidden deep in the forest, buildings still covered in now historically protected camouflage paint.

At the Battalion I was fortunate to meet with the Air Team and inspect some of their drones and their counter drone equipment. It was great to speak with their members about the benefits and challenges our agencies face, even on the other side of the world, like most elements of the policing vocation they are the same. I then met with members of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Technical Unit who took me on a detailed tour of the equipment the unit deploys, such as their Water Canon, Barricade Busters, Armoured Rescue, and the trusty Mercedes Sprinter Riot Response Vehicles. The Water Connon was especially impressive and the tactics it operates with were of value.



After some lunch with the unit's members, some discussions on tactics and the mandatory patch swapping it was time for me to go. Manuel and the Riot Battalion were welcoming and gave me an how а well-established insight into experienced Riot Squad operates in the current protest climate; the insights I can bring home will be of value to our team in Canberra as it develops. On 26 September, it was time for me to pack up and say goodbye to Berlin. I spent the morning revisiting some sites I missed, I wanted to see the Reichstag and revisit some of the locations I did not get to see in detail on the walking tour, such as the Government quarter and Checkpoint Charlie.

After lunch I bid goodbye to Berlin and took the fast train to Hamburg.

#### **HAMBURG**

On arriving in Hamburg, I was meet at the Hauptbahnhof by Jorn and Sibil from IPA Hamburg. After a meet and greet Sibel and Tyron took me on a ride along around their patrol area which covers the central area of Hamburg and the train stations, I saw firsth and the issues with drugs, alcohol and crime, like any major city, community policing is at its core the same and it brings a sense of comfort and solace to see the same challenges faced at home. Later that evening I met with fellow IPA members for dinner. Jorn organised a traditional German dinner with meat and beer and some great company in the form of the Hamburg IPA chapter. The dinner was filled with stories from work, the differences in our agencies and our IPA experiences abroad.



On 27 September, Jorn met me early on the day to see the Bundapolizei Bomb Disposal Unit at Hamburg International Airport. The IPA Team in Hamburg arranged for me to spend the morning with the unit, like the Riot Squad in Berlin.

I was particularly looking forward to this experience as a Bomb Technician in Canberra. To my enjoyment walking into the Bomb Squads hunger was like walking into our officers at home, it was a warm and inviting place full of robots, training equipment and memorabilia. Christian, Kay, and Paul showed me their equipment and as a recruit course was also running, I was given a tour of their equipment by one of the new recruits under the close observation of the team. It was humbling to see the same bonds and dedication nations specialisation across jurisdictions. After a couple of coffees, some patch swapping, and the presentation of a plaque Jorn and I left the airport for a walking tour of the city.



The remainder of the day Jorn showed me the sights of Hamburg; the impressive port where we had lunch and spoke with some retired bankers, the remaining air raid tower from WW2 and some of the police divisions such as the famous Davidache in the night district. Later that afternoon I met with Sibel for her team's socialising day where I spent the afternoon with some of Hamburg's finest. On 28 September I left Hamburg for Dusseldorf, like Berlin the visit was too short, but I met some great new friends, I saw lots of historic/epic city sites, next stop was Dusseldorf.



I had nothing organised in Dusseldorf, so I undertook a relaxing walk around the city looking at cites and enjoying more fine baked goods, meats, and beers. The following morning, I explored the Rhine streets and shops before being picked up by the IPA driver for my trip to Gimborn. I met with the driver at the train station for a short drive to Gimborn. On arrival it was late and dark but fortunately my room was easy to find and so was the Turmbar where I met with some of my Gimborn colleagues from both my seminar and the other courses running. I was still in awe of the 12<sup>th</sup> century castle I was staying in and the social bar area complete with medieval shields, banners, and armour for knights.

On 30 September, the seminar started with the traditional meet and greets and then straight into presentations. The course was made up of existing or aspiring drone operators from the United States, Germany, Ireland, Belgium, and Pakistan. Our seminar lecturers John, David and Tim are all from law enforcement in the United States, except David who was a Firefighter, and he was reminded of that daily.



The seminar covered a range of topics such as: drones in police work, crowd management, counter UAS, mapping basics, fundamentals of flying, UAV training, NIST, indoor tactical flying and the use of thermals.

Along with the seminar sessions we were introduced to arrange practical drone flying skills such as flying with VR headsets, flying inside buildings, search sweeps and the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) method for skill testing. We were fortunate to have guest speakers from the Belgium Federal Police Drone Unit in Genk. Bart and his team have developed an excellent response capability using drones for and surveillance, especially intelligence response to crowd control and port protection. Along with tactics and deployment options we enjoyed a range of demonstrations and examples of effective use of the technology.

Along with our guest speakers our course managers John and Tim provided expert advice and presentations based on their countless years of experience running drone programs in their home jurisdictions in Florida and California. John and Tim brought extensive value to their presentations having been responsible for the development of their police agencies drone programs. They presented on the use of drones order, public events and a 24 month study John conducted of drones being used to detect gravesites using infrared and ultraviolet cameras with impressive results.

A large component of the seminar was focused on the NIST method for testing standards. David took us through a range of programs NIST has undertaken with a focus on drone methods and testing. I found it immensely valuable as the NIST method and material can be adapted to a range of policing specialisations and tasks. I was particularly interested in the NIST methods as a Bomb Technician, the organization offers a range of training programs and material to provide standardized testing regimes. The NIST material will provide a solid foundation for understanding testing regimes for skillsets such as drones and bomb response robots.

Along with five days of drone flying and presentations, the seminar undertook a trip to Cologne. I was keen to try the Kosh beers in Cologne and fortunately there was a brewery close by to where we were dropped off. Cologne was a beautiful city and provided an excellent opportunity to purchase some gifts for my wife and son while seeing the sites.

The seminar was a valuable undertaking and a great use of the Arthur Troop scholarship; not just for the benefits of attending the course, learning more about the fundamentals of drone use in policing. I also valued the opportunity to visit Gimborn and network with fellow IPA members from around.

The seminar and networking I experienced has provided valuable tools to progress my understanding of drones, their use in my agency and how they can be best used to support police operations.





#### **KOBLENZ**

After the seminar and a momentous week at Gimborn my next stop was Koblenz. On 4 October I arrived in Koblenz, and it was a beautiful night, so I took advantage of the weather and went for a walk around the new part of the city. The following morning, I was picked up at my accommodation by Ruidiger from IPA Koblenz. Our first stop for the day was the Police Operations Centre in the Rhineland- Palatinate Police Headquarters. As I currently work in Police Operations, I was interested in how our German colleagues manage their workloads and dispatch patrols. It was interesting to see the systems in place and how resources were managed, I was also granted permission to get a photo at the operations managers desk and run the district for about 5 seconds. Later, I was invited to inspect the stations patrol vehicles. Koblenz was the first location in Germany I had attended that utilised Audi station wagons as patrol vehicles, while not downplaying my Kia Sorento the Audi was an excellent looking patrol vehicle, the incorporation of the weapons and protection in the rear of the vehicle was impressive and practical.





After the Police visit Ruidiger took me on a tour of City, Koblenz is a beautiful city with a rich history. We visited the old city and had lunch at a small pub next to the Mosal River. We visited the Kaiser-Wilhelm Monument where the Mosal and the Rhine rivers meet. It's a fantastic monument to empire, something we simply don't build anymore, interesting the allied soldiers shot the top off the monument, and it was rebuilt later after the war, everywhere you look there is a scratch or bruise rom a time long ago weather American, French, Roman, it is a city with a rich history. After a brief trip in the cable car, we arrived at the Ehrenbreitstein Fortress sitting atop the Mosal valley. The gigantic fortress was built by the Prussians between 1817 and 1828.

On 6 October Ruidiger picked me up from my accommodation to go meet with Claudia, another IPA member in Koblenz. Claudia offered to take me on a tour of the roman stone mine before going to the Rhineland-Palatinate Police Aerial Unit. The mine was amazing, a rich history of the construction and mining methods of ancient Rome. On arrival at Koblenz-Winningen Airport I was met with the noise of two police helicopters taking off in a southernly direction, I later found out the helicopters were leaving on a training mission near Munich.

We meet with Thomas one of the chief pilots and a Polizeihaupt Kommissar. Thomas showed us the existing Airbus helicopters and the newmodel they had recently received. We discussed the usefulness and benefits of the airwing and some of the challenges airwings face with the introduction of drones. As my agency does not have a traditional airwing it was insightful to hear about the types of incidents the helicopter responds to and their abilities.

Soon it was time to leave Koblenz and go to my final destination Frankfurt. Koblenz was a lovely city, and I made some great friends in Ruidiger and Claudia.



#### **FRANKFURT**

On 6 October I took my final Deutsche Bahn train ride to Frankfurt. When I arrived in Frankfurt, I knew instantly it was a bigger and busier city, the train station and the mood of the place was more fast paced then Koblenz and Hamburg, even Berlin. I had nothing planned on the 7<sup>th</sup> of October; it was an opportunity to explore the city. My accommodation was near Romer, the city's 14<sup>th</sup> century city hall, I enjoyed breakfast and a coffee walking around the old part of the city.

After a stroll down the Rhine, I decided to attend the Kreminal Police Museum, on arrival I found out it was only open to School and police groups by appointment; but the museum was near the Deutsche Bundesbank Museum (Germany's Central Bank), as a former banker I could not pass up the opportunity to see some currency and bullion. In the afternoon while exploring the city I stumbled into an Asian food market and then another museum about life for children under the nazi's, it was yet another example which was present throughout my trip of the changes and adaptability of the German people, acceptance of the past and how they move forward as united people.



On 8 October I packed my bag for the last time in Germany and left my accommodation knowing I was now in the end zone and mentally preparing for yet another long trip. I had planned to meet with Julien and Dirk, IPA Frankfurt members at the 4<sup>th</sup> Polizeirevier, the hardest Police station in Frankfurt. Kirk, a Polizeihaupt Kommissar at the station met me outside with Julian who works at another station on the outskirts. Julian made a special trip into the city to come and meet me, which was great. Kirk organised for one of his units to take me on a ride along and show me the sites of the dark part of town.

After a brief introduction and trying on the active shooter kits we went for a tour of the hard streets of Frankfurt, inspecting some hotels and a drop-in center for drug users. Germany has an advanced version of the drug decimalisation laws we have in Canberra; it was insightful to see how the laws had changed the culture and makeup of the inner city. While we were walking the beat Julian intercepted a female with a rifle butt in her handbag, not a normal item to have in central Frankfurt. We toured the area and tried to find some jobs to tag onto. We only had one job which was a hire car collision. The team showed me how they complete the entire investigation using a dedicated phone app on their issued mobile phones. After a quick tour to the top of the Deutsche Bahn Tower to see the city views, we found out the riot squad were undertaking a 'control operation' near the train station. On arrival at the control order, I saw about police with the same number of pedestrians lined up against a wall in varied stages of being searched. While German laws collectively reduce police powers to search, the control order allows police to stop groups of people for the purpose of conducting checks and searches, but only in specific areas of high crime like central Frankfurt.



After some more coins, shield and patch swaps it was time to head to the airport. Julian was kind enough to give me a final ride on the autobahn before heading home. Two days later I arrived home with plenty of patches, new friends and found memories of my German adventure.



I would like to thank the IPA for entrusting me with the scholarship and all the IPA members who took time out of their busy lives to show me their work, their cities and in many cases meet their friends and family.

The scholarship and travel were a fantastic experience, one I will cherish forever. I would encourage anyone who has not applied for the scholarship to think creatively, find something you want to achieve to better yourself and the IPA, then simply apply and keep applying. The networks, friends, and memories I gained from this experience will last a lifetime. We have a unique and special connection in our professional vocations, our blue family does not stop at borders. The IPA links those bonds across jurisdictions, countries, and oceans.
